	A: The child has started at the school. The child is attending Wed, Thurn d Fri for an hour a day
	and has alternative provision in place. There are fortnightly team around the family meetings in
	place. Mum is very supported and wants specialist provision, parents are pushing for this but the
	local authority instructed the school to take the child.
